Dr Ebere N. Okereke is an independent global health strategist, board chair and strategic adviser with more than 30 years of leadership across Africa, the United Kingdom, the Gulf and other international settings. She advises leaders and institutions on strategy, governance, health financing, partnerships, institutional positioning and strategic risk.

Ebere has held executive and senior advisory and technical roles at the Mohamed bin Zayed Foundation for Humanity, Africa Public Health Foundation, Africa CDC, the Tony Blair Institute for Global Change, Public Health England and the UK Health Security Agency. She was the first substantive Chief Executive Officer of the Africa Public Health Foundation and served as Honorary Senior Strategic Adviser to the founding Director of Africa CDC.

She chairs PSI Europe and serves in board, advisory and technical roles with organisations including WHO, Novartis Global Health, DNDi, PharmAccess Nigeria and the Healthcare Federation of Nigeria. A physician, author and speaker, she writes and speaks on African institutional agency, global health reform, health security, financing and leadership. She is an Associate Fellow of Chatham House.
